daa Actions from Previous Meetings and Subsequent Requests

No	Action	daa Response
1.	daa to correct presentation to reflect correct figures of 374,000 passengers for first four months 2018	The presentation has been corrected and added to the CLG area of the website
2.	daa to consider leaflet drop for Drop-In Information Clinic in St Margarets	Leaflet drop carried out in the St Margarets area on the 4 th and 5 th July for the Drop In Information Clinic that took place on the 12 th July. A second leaflet drop was also carried out in certain areas
3.	daa and FCC to engage directly with SMCRG on any local area issues that may concern it	daa will engage directly with the group with any future correspondence that directly relates to them

North Runway Update

- Phase 1 surveys completed for participants in insulation schemes.
- Statements of Need will issue when analysis is complete and information meeting will be scheduled
- CP2 tender process nearing completion
 - Expect mobilisation to commence in Q4
 - Construction will commence in January 2019 and take c. 2 years to complete



Runway 10/28 Overlay and Associated Taxiways

- Main works completed on Monday 4th of June 2018
- Some snagging works being carried out for a four hour period at night for the next six weeks.



Dublin Airport Update

- Busiest June ever in the history of the airport with 3.1 million passengers, a 7% increase over the same month last year
- New routes:
 - Ryanair – Dublin to Dalaman
 - Ryanair – Dublin to Southend
 - Norwegian – Dublin to Toronto
 - Additional frequency Lufthansa Frankfurt and Norwegian to Boston next year.
- Dublin Airport has partnered with NCAD with an open call to invite anyone to submit a piece of work which will be displayed in Dublin Airport for up to 15 months.
- An 80% saving in car park energy consumption has been achieved, due to an upgrade to the lighting and control systems used in one of the short-term and some of the long-term surface car parks.
- Dublin Airport has renewed its commitment to Airport's Council International (ACI) Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) at Level 2 (Reduction) for another year.
- Next drop in Clinic in September in Kinsealy. Date and time to be confirmed.
